My priorities

The NPF needs to become more relevant. At present the NPF meets just once or twice a year and deals solely with long-term policy. The NPF should conduct the majority of its business online, making it easier to debate and agree positions quickly. Shadow ministers should never be lost for words when asked the obvious question – "So what would *you* do?"

Labour needs to stand up for community comprehensive education. I oppose academies and free schools - the Tories are using these to destroy national pay bargaining and remove accountability within the education sector. Schools should be encouraged to innovate whilst remaining under local authority control. We should also advocate equality of treatment for mature learners.

Undergraduate tuition fees need to be reduced. Average fees in England are the third highest in the developed world, according to OECD; soon they'll be even higher. We need to follow the lead of Wales' Labour Government and keep higher education affordable to all.

People need access to affordable credit. The banks must be persuaded - or obliged - to lend once again. We must tackle the unaccountable powers of the credit reference agencies.

My other policies include:

- Action on fuel poverty renationalise National Grid and legislate to reduce utility prices;
- Support the right of same-sex couples to marry;
- Justice for the Chagos Islanders betrayed, sadly, by our Labour government;
- A fully elected House of Lords.
